SUBJECT: 2013-14 Commodity Quote Recommendations

There were three quotes submitted for the bakery products; two quotes for dairy products, LP Gas and trash removal service. Quote amounts are reflected on the attached spreadsheets:

- 1. Aunt Millie's Bakeries, Bimbo Bakeries USA and Klosterman Baking Company provided quotes for the bakery products. Because some of the quoted packaged products contained different packaging count sizes, you will notice some variance in the quantity amounts between vendors. The quantity amounts were changed in order to break down the costs and compare "apples to apples". Aunt Millie's Bakeries, our current provider, provided a quote of \$14,505; while Klosterman Baking Company quote came in at \$14,529. They are once again close quotes with only a \$24 difference between them. Bimbo Bakeries USA submitted a quote of \$15,004; however, they did not quote all items. I recommend the board approve Aunt Millie's Bakeries as our bakery provider for the 2013-2014 school year and they were the lowest, responsible quote.
- 2. There were two quotes for the dairy products which included a firm and an escalator quote: Prairie Farms and Schenkel's Dairy. We have always opted to go with the firm price on dairy and wish to continue at this time. Prairie Farms submitted a firm quote of \$51,588 while Schenkel's Dairy firm quote totaled \$52,866. I recommend the board approve Prairie Farms as the 2013-2014 dairy product provider as being the lowest, responsible quote.
- 3. There were quotes received from AmeriGas and Co-Alliance for the 2013-2014 LP Gas. AmeriGas gave a firm quote of \$1.7900. Co-Alliance gave a firm quote of \$1.4976 and a floating quote of 1.2802 as of April 30th, 2013. I am recommending that the board accept the lowest firm price from Co-Alliance which is \$1.4976 as the lowest, responsible quote.
- 4. There were two quotes for the 2013-2014 trash removal service. Smith Trash Service submitted a quote of \$2,000.00 per month for the months of August, 2013 thru May, 2014 with a \$60.00 cost for any additional pick up during June and July. Waste Management submitted a quote of \$1,271.35 per month for the same time period with a \$52.00 cost for additional pick up during for the two summer months. I am recommending that the board accept the lowest, responsible quote from Waste Management as the 2013-2014 trash removal service.

Any vendor that is awarded a bid and subsequently provides services or products that are unsatisfactory, the School Board will award the bid to another vendor for those services or products. 1. MILK PRODUCTS

TEACHER EMPLOYMENT QUALIFICATIONS

BP - 3010

The superintendent of the Western Boone County Community School Corporation has the responsibility for nominating personnel. The power of appointment rests with the Board of Education.

All new teachers employed in the Western Boone County Community School Corporation must have a bachelor's degree from an accredited college, must be certified by the State of Indiana, must hold a valid Indiana Teaching License and must have a cleared Expanded Criminal History Report . In cases of emergency, a permit may be sought by the Board of Education.

All assignments shall be for the school year in which they are made or for the unexpired portion of the school year following the date of appointment.

Assignments may be made to any position for which, at the time of such assignment, the teacher has no certificate but is qualified to perform such duties assigned.

Any teacher desiring a change of assignment should contact the superintendent's office immediately upon receipt of an appointment letter.

Assignments to positions are generally completed by August 1, and hopefully no later than two weeks before school starts.

Unless notified of a change of assignment, there can be a reasonable assumption that the assignment held by the teacher during the previous year will remain in effect.

All records pertaining to training and experience of the teacher must be verified and be on file in the superintendent's office by August 1.

GENERAL FUND COMPARISON REPORT:

As of April 30, 2013, the General Fund cash balance is \$1,889,001. The 2013 General Fund Appropriation is approved at \$12,034,150. At the end of April, 2013, we have had a total expenditure of \$3,506,547 or 29% of the total 2013 appropriation.
