Please see the revised 2013-2014 textbook fees for Grade 2 as shown below. Teachers will use the spelling materials included in the newly adopted Reading Street reading program, eliminating the need for a separate spelling workbook at second grade. The change will reduce the textbook fees in 2nd grade from \$99.00 to \$80.00.

IMMUNIZATIONS REQUIREMENTS FOR SCHOOL ENTRANCE

BP - 1320

Each child who is enrolling in Western Boone County Community School Corporation for the first time shall meet the immunization requirements under state law.

The following Immunuzations are required:

Tdap: Diphtheria, Tetnus, Pertussis (Whooping Cough)

MMR: Measles, Rubella, Mumps

Poliomyelitis Hepatitus B

Varicella: Chicken Pox -2 doses for all students PreK -12^{th} grade. Meningitis (MCV4) -1 dose required for 6^{th} grade students. Hepatitus A -2 doses for all students entering kindergarten.

Booster Meningitis (MCV4) - 1 dose recommended for all students grades 11 and 12.

The dose required for the above-listed diseases are the amount of doses recommended by the American Academy of Pediatrics of the United States Public Health Service Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices at the time the child enrolls in the Western Boone County Community School Corporation.

A written document, signed by the parent(s) or guardian(s), must state that the objection to immunization is based on religious grounds and must be renewed each year. This statement must be delivered to the school office before the start of the school year.

In no case shall a child be permitted to attend school more than twenty (20) days beyond the date of his/her enrollment without furnishing documentation of the immunization/test or a valid written objection to the immunization requirement.

If any physician certifies that a particular required immunization is or may be detrimental to the child's health, the requirement for that particular immunization is inapplicable for that child until it is found no longer detrimental to the child's health.

BULLYING

BP 6050

In accordance with state law, bullying is prohibited in the Western Boone School Corporation. Bullying means overt, unwanted, repeated acts or gestures, including verbal or written communications or images transmitted in any manner (including digitally or electronically), physical acts committed, aggression, or any other behaviors, that are committed by a student or group of students against another student with the intent to harass, ridicule, humiliate, intimidate, or harm the targeted student and create for the targeted student an objectively hostile school environment.

Parents or students who suspect that repeated acts of bullying are taking place should report the matter to the school principal or designee. Upon receiving the report, the principal/designee will investigate the matter at the building level and school consequences will be assessed as appropriate.

NON-RESIDENT STUDENT ADMISSION

BP 6195

The Board of School Trustees recognizes that a child must be a legal resident of the Western Boone County Community School Corporation in order to attend its schools. The Board further recognizes that extenuating circumstances often arise and it is for these cases that the following regulations have been adopted.

It is the intent of the Board that all applicable policies and laws in regard to student transfers shall be strictly enforced.

Requests by parents, guardians, or custodians of Indiana students who do not reside in the Western Boone County Community School Corporation but who wish to enroll their child in the school system will be considered for enrollment if:

- Non-resident enrollment is for educational reasons;
- Non-resident student is in good standing in their resident school corporation;
- Parents, guardians, or custodians agree to provide transportation to and from the school, unless
 there is an established residence in our district with an adult accepting responsibility of this
 arrangement.
- Once the written request (see application form) is submitted it will not need to be renewed unless the parents/guardians and student are notified differently by the administration.
- Not for athletic purposes.
- Payment of all Textbooks and Fees must be made before or on the first day of attendance.
- Those who move out of district, after they have been counted on ADM, may request to stay. They must complete the Transfer Form, be in good standing and acquire principal signature of approval.
- The student's disciplinary record is in good standing at the previous school. Western Boone shall deny a request if the student has previously been suspended or expelled.

Students transferring to the Corporation from other schools shall be placed in those classes or at those grade levels for which their previous educational experiences appear to qualify them. The School Corporation reserves the right to change or modify such placements on the basis of later information, testing, or investigation. The School Corporation may dismiss any student who does not comply with adopted school rules while attending Western Boone Schools.

Students and parents may be asked to participate in an interview by the principal or designee of the receiving school prior to the consideration of the transfer.

Requests must be submitted by September 1 of the school year. Those studentss previously accepted as non-resident students may continue their education at WBCCSC as long as they meet the above criteria.

GENERAL FUND COMPARISON REPORT:

As of June 30, 2013, the General Fund cash balance is \$1,937,316. The 2013 General Fund Appropriation is approved at \$12,034,150. At the end of June, 2013, we have had a total expenditure of \$5,201,265 or 43% of the total 2013 appropriation.

When the State of Indiana set up the Choice Scholarship, it was stated that any savings from this program would be distributed to all school corporations and charter schools based on their ADM. In June, the Western Boone School Corporation received \$7,802 from the State of Indiana for the 2012-2013 Choice Scholarship Savings.
