### SCHOOL DISMISSAL DUE TO INCLEMENT WEATHER

School will remain open in Western Boone each school day unless inclement weather conditions bring about a crucial safety hazard to students getting to and from school. Officials will determine as early as possible if the schools are to be closed.

Parents will be contacted via the Student Notification System along with WRTV (Channel 6), WISH (Channel 8), WTHR (Channel 13), WXIN (Channel 59) and WTTV (Channel 4). Weather delays and closings are also posted on our school website and on Twitter. If severe weather conditions arise during the school day, the bus drivers will be notified and plans for dismissal will be made. However, at these times telephone lines often are jammed and communication is difficult. The radio stations will be alerted with an announcement. Parents are urged to make arrangements in advance for such an emergency that would involve their children. Heavy fog may make driving hazardous in a portion of the Western Boone Corporation, which includes six townships. Each driver has the option of delaying for one hour or two hours if the driver deems conditions are too severe. That driver will attempt to notify the homes of the children on the route.

When weather is bad, but not severe enough to close schools, buses will be traveling slower than usual and may be behind schedule. If more than ten minutes late, it is suggested that parents check the radio to see if schools are closed. It is possible that on a given day one road might be blocked when the other roads are accessible. In this case the bus driver may not attempt to drive that section of the route. Students who are missed because the road is blocked will not be counted absent on the day that the bus driver could not pick them up.

Procedures to be followed for extra-curricular activities due to inclement weather:

Morning Delay in School- No morning practices

Early Dismissal of School- No practice or games.

- Discretion of the Superintendent will be used when unusual circumstances arise.

Re: National Honor Society Changes

On behalf of the Faculty Council and the Western Boone Chapter of the National Honor Society ("NHS"), I would like to inform the board of the changes that are being made to NHS in the 2015-2016 school year.

- 1. The cumulative GPA requirement for new and continued membership will be increased from a 3.5 to a 3.67. This ensures that we are maintaining high academic expectations for our members.
- 2. We will now be offering membership to incoming junior students who meet the qualification standards. This will develop Western Boone's Chapter by increasing membership, without decreasing membership expectations, and alleviating the pressure put on senior students during their membership.
- 3. The induction ceremony for NHS will now occur in the fall to ensure full participation of our junior and senior members.
- 4. The number of required service hours per member will increase from forty hours to seventy hours beginning with the fall 2015 class. These seventy community-service hours must be completed before the conclusion of the members' two-year membership.
- 5. We will be introducing the concept of merit points to the current and future members. Merit points will be awarded to students for participating in other organizations, receiving awards for academics/athletics, and for maintaining outstanding character. The use of merit points will help validate whether individual members are satisfying the four tenets of NHS (character, leadership, scholarship service). The members will need to complete ten merit points throughout membership.
- 6. The student handbook will be changed as follows:

### National Honor Society Selection Process:

Western Boone's chapter abides by the Constitution of the National Honor Society. To be eligible for admission, students must have attended Western Boone Jr.-Sr. High School for at least one semester and have a 3.67 cumulative grade point average at the end of four and/or six semesters. In addition, potential members must have taken or be taking

two classes designated as honors, AP, or ACP. Eligible students will be asked to complete a Student Activity Information Form. These will be evaluated by the NHS Faculty Council. In addition to grade and course work, integrity, positive behaviors, cooperation, ethics, and leadership will be assessed. Invitations and/or regrets will be sent to all eligible students applying for membership.

We hope that these changes will continue the outstanding reputation of NHS. Thank you for your continued support of our endeavors.

Laura Folz National Honor Society Adviser Western Boone High School By definition: Reduction in force (RIF) [i.e., the cancelation or non-renewal ("termination")] at the end of the current contract term of one or more certificated staff members based on a decrease in the number of teachers needed in a particular area. Prior to a RIF being implemented, the superintendent shall make a recommendation to the board of school trustees as to the need and basis for the RIF. If the board authorizes the RIF, the superintendent shall work with the administrative team to identify the areas subject to being RIF'd and apply the considerations and criteria set forth in these guidelines.

The following guidelines will apply only to the probationary and professional teachers in the content area to be reduced when the teaching content area to be reduced has both established teachers and probationary and/or professional teachers assigned to the content area.

If the teaching content area being reduced has only established teachers assigned to the area, the following guidelines apply to all established teachers in that content area. Those established teachers who are licensed in another content area cannot be subject to the reduction in force if these established teachers are able to replace a probationary or professional teacher in the licensed area.

The termination of a teacher's contract through RIF shall be determined on the basis of the teacher's own demonstrated performance as reflected in the teacher's most recent evaluations. In those teaching content areas determined to require a reduction in force, a teacher certificated in the area who is rated less effective will be subject to termination before a teacher rated more effective will be subject to the same. The order of effectiveness from least to greatest will be as follows:

- 1. Ineffective
- 2. Improvement Necessary
- 3. Effective
- 4. Highly Effective

Personnel who receive a performance rating of ineffective shall be subject to termination first.

Personnel who receive a performance rating of improvement necessary shall be subject to termination secondly.

Personnel who receive a performance rating of effective shall be subject to termination thirdly.

Personnel who receive a performance rating of highly-effective shall be subject to termination only after all of the above reference criteria have been met.

Teacher performance and effectiveness will be considered over a time frame limited to the past three \* consecutive years. If three years of evaluative data is not available, the most recent two years or one year of data will be used. All evaluation data will be limited to data collected while a teacher in this school corporation.

In cases where more than one teacher's effectiveness categories are the same, the administration will consider the following factors before making a determination as to which teacher and/or teachers in the same effectiveness category shall be subject to termination, with the order of importance from most to least being:

- 1. The numerical rating of the teachers' evaluation
- 2. The academic needs of the students in the school corporation
- 3. Current instructional and extra-duty leadership roles
- 4. Additional teaching licensure obtained or soon to be obtained
- 5. Credit hours earned
- 6. Recommendations and advice from others in the administration
- 7. Years of teaching experience

The manner by which these factors are considered and applied in distinguishing among teachers with the same level of effectiveness shall not be subject to discovery by the affected teacher. Decisions of the administration in assigning an effectiveness category or comparing teachers within the same category will be final, subject to such review or reconsideration as the board of school trustees may permit in its sole discretion.

### Conflict of Interest

All employees shall perform their duties in a manner free from conflict of interest to ensure that the school corporation's business transactions are made in compliance with applicable laws and regulations and in a manner that maintains public confidence in the schools.

No employee shall participate in the selection, award or administration of a contract supported by federal funds or in any other transaction in which the school corporation is a party if he/she has a real or apparent conflict of interest in the transaction.

A conflict of interest would arise when the employee or any member of his/her immediate family, his/her (business) partner, or an organization that employs or is about to employ any of these parties has a financial or other interest in the entity selected for the award. For the purpose of this policy, "immediate family" is defined as spouse, brother, sister, parent, son or daughter.

### **Staff Gifts and Solicitations**

All employees are prohibited from accepting money or things of material value from persons or entities doing business with, or desiring to do business with, the school corporation. Employees may accept unsolicited items of nominal value such as those that are generally distributed by a company or organization through its public relations program.

### **Violations**

Employees who violate this code of conduct may be subject to discipline, up to and including termination of employment.

Drug and Alcohol policy changes

I have updated Western Boone Community Schools' DOT Drug and Alcohol testing policy, with the help of Midwest Toxicology. These changes were made to bring the policy into compliance with FMCSC regulations

This is a summary of the changes made to the drug and alcohol policy.

- 1. Under Pre-employment, the type of test used is identified as "urine".
- 2. The policy now lists the drugs we are testing for; "marijuana, cocaine, opiates, amphetamines, and phencyclidine (PCP)".
- 3. The policy replaces the treatment options for a positive drug or alcohol test with immediate termination.
- 4. Changes the program administrator from "Business Manager" to "Transportation Director".
- 5. The policy keeps the Alcohol testing pool at 25%, which is higher than FMCSA's 10% minimum requirement.

Re: Rainy Day Fund

Per the Indiana Code, a Rainy Day Fund is a financial line that can be established so that it may assist the school corporation based on Board approval.

The Rainy Day Fund was originally established in 2002 which includes the following transfers:

2002	~	\$ 92,300
2008	-	\$100,000
2010	~	\$295,000
2011		\$100,000
2012	-	\$375,562.44
2014	-	\$150,000

The Rainy Day Fund balance is currently \$1,083,518. When the Western Boone Media Center project is completed, the fund balance will be reduced to \$924,862.

As of December 31, 2014, the corporation had unexpended appropriated dollars remaining in the Transportation and Bus Replacement Funds which is not figured into the 2015 appropriated budget. I would like to make the recommendation to the Board that we transfer the following into the Rainy Day Fund:

Transportation Fund:	\$ 75,000.00
Bus Replacement Fund:	\$ 75,000.00
TOTAL:	\$150,000.00

This would bring the total Rainy Day Fund to \$1,074,862.

### **BOARD RESOLUTION TO TRANSFER FUNDS**

WHEREAS, Indiana Code 36-1-8-5.1 allows a school corporation to establish a Rainy Day Fund to transfer unused and unencumbered balances from funds raised by a tax levy, up to a maximum of ten percent of the total budget for that fiscal year,

**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT** the Board hereby transfers \$75,000 from the Transportation Fund (Fund 410); and \$75,000 from the Bus Replacement Fund (Fund 420) to the Rainy Day Fund (Fund 610) for the 2014-2015 fiscal year.

The intent of the Board of School Trustees is to use the monies in the Rainy Day Fund for purposes the Board deems necessary.

The Western Boone School Corporation provides opportunities for employees to invest into a 403B Annuity Plan. There are different qualifying plans based on whether you are a certified or non-certified employee. The majority of the employee benefit plans offer some type of corporation matching funds.

Western Boone School Corporation has been associated with VALIC since 1993 as the plan record keeper for our 403B Annuity Plan. One America would be responsible for the establishment of the plan, daily administrative functions, and updates to the plans as needed. The combination of Edward Jones and One America would allow our employees to receive quality service again.
